## Psalm 50 and Reformation Remembrance in October Worship

"Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and make good your vows to the Most High." Psalm 50:14

We haven't been passing the offering plate since March 2020 B.C. Week three: Make God your vows


Week four: To the Most High


And the last week in October we remember the Reformation and will most certainly sing "A Mighty Fortress".


