

As we come to the end of the year, and look toward 2022, these words remain with me. They are the theme of the Thanksgiving Eve service, from the hymn "Now Thank We All Our God." It is true that it is a prayer for us as individuals, but also a prayer for us as a people of God, doing the work of God at Holy Cross Lutheran Church. In the past months, I have had the joy of being among our people who look to the future of the congregation. Yes, there is concern about the church in general and about our congregation in particular. Yet, there is great hope and looking forward to new things, new possibilities, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Holy Cross WELCA (the Women of the ELCA) met at their general meeting in October to think of new ways to raise funds to serve ministries.

The Holy Cross Church Council has worked on vision and mission.

The Mission Endowment Team is looking toward using the endowment interest to support ministries this year and in the future. (Learn more about this on December 12th following worship as Sara Callaghan with Lutheran Giving visits Holy Cross.)

The Vision and Mission team is looking at new ways to connect: to connect within our congregation and in our community. They have had a lot of fun dreaming and you will hear much more on this in the next months.

As Church Council leadership began the visioning, with the leadership of Matthew Ames-Woolsey, who continues to guide and lead the Vision and Mission team from his new home in Washington State, with our sincere thanks, we looked at the golden circles of **What** we do, **how** we do it and **WHY** we are here. Why we exist in the first place, since the ground work for Holy Cross began three years before the article published September 17, 1965 (see the article on the next page). The WHY is at the very center, the heart of Holy Cross. Our center is Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:10)

From that center we looked at the values our congregation holds and narrowed it down to 4:

- Community: Living together with mutual support, interdependence and fellowship.
- Generosity: Giving freely in a spirit of abundance.
- Hospitality: Being intentionally welcoming, especially of guests and strangers, with genuine care and concern for their needs.
- Serving: Helping others and caring for those in need.

Then the brainstorming team began to have fun imagining new possibilities based on these values! Look for more in January as they continue to envision possibilities and where you can plug in as ground work is laid for 2022 and beyond. Through all our life be near us Lord!

Begin ground work for new church here

Wenske announced that will begin first services Oct. 10 in the multipurpose room of Lincoln School, continuing there each Sunday until the new building is completed The list of charter members will begin at the Oct. 10 service. will remain open This until some time after the first building unit was completed, he said.


Analytic Reasons to Contemplate Planned Giving

We expect if we have an estate plan, all is taken care of, but derailers can occur, leaving a different result for the reality of our estate. Some thoughts to consider as you implement charitable giving into your estate plan might be:

SOUND AND STREAMING SYSTEM UPGRADES APPROVED - FUNDING IS NEEDED

At the special congregational meeting on October 24, the congregation approved a sound system and streaming upgrade. We will be working with Yandas Pro Audio and Video of Kearney on these projects.

The sound system upgrade will improve the sound in the sanctuary, narthex, fellowship hall, and conference room. The sound and the picture will be improved when showing videos using our current projector. Sound can be adjusted in the sanctuary during worship.


The streaming would be done with one fixed camera in the sanctuary, which would be controlled remotely. The upgrade will improve the sound and picture in the broadcasts of our worship services. Sound from videos, choir, and congregation singing would now be included in the broadcast. Worship services will continue to be live streamed. A recording of worship will be available electronically and via a DVD by request. A second camera could be added to the system in the future.

There is a link to their most recent recording of worship on their homepage. Also look at the recorded worship services on any other church you choose. Please provide input about what works for you and what doesn't work for you when watching a video stream of worship. Are you comfortable with Facebook? Would you prefer YouTube? Zoom? Are we reaching members when traveling or in extended stays in other locations? Are we reaching our homebound members and members in Long Term Care Facilities with streaming? Do we still need to provide DVDs? Please share you input with Dallen Johnsen, Tom Karlin, or Gail Russell.

Please consider a donation toward this project as soon as you are able. Prices and delivery of

electronic equipment is changing very rapidly, so our current quote is probably only valid until the end of 2021. If we commit now, installation could probably take place in February.


