

As I write this reflection in mid-December, looking to the new year, I am reading the Christmas message of Elizabeth Eaton, Presiding Bishop of the ELCA. We have just had our second pandemic Christmas. Last year Eric and I were both in quarantine and could not worship on Christmas Eve or Christmas. There are people in our congregation who have struggled this past year, some who have had Covid or other illnesses, some who have had deep sorrow and grief.

So as we go into the new year, might we be wondering, as Bishop Eaton noted: "Why have hope? Just give up."

But her message continues: "But we have a hope that's stronger than any of this, stronger even than death. The hope of God comes in the form of a tiny baby, a helpless child; nevertheless, who grew to a man and in his fragile strength was willing to die on the cross and was raised again. I don't know what next Christmas will bring. I don't know what New Year's will bring. But I do know we have hope. St. Paul put it this way: 'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may ABOUND IN HOPE by the power of the Holy Spirit.'"

May these hopeful words from St. Paul in his letter to the church in Rome (Romans 15:13) be words to carry with us throughout 2022.

There will be no Faithbuilders on December 26 or January 2. Classes will resume January 9.


A new year of Adult Education each Sunday!

Inscription: Using chalk, write on the outside of your house's door or frame (or on a path or driveway, or above or next to an entrance):



The inscription stands for the first half of the current year written out, Christe mansionem benedica (Christ bless this house), then the other half of the current year written out, beginning and ending with a cross. Each marking or word could be written by a member of the household, if desired. The leader can share a prayer of their own or simply ask God to bless your home as the markings are made.

When finished, all can join in a **Prayer of Blessing**: O God, you revealed your Son to all people by the shining light of a star. We pray that you bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence. May your love be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Christ our Lord. Amen.


