The app sends alerts five times a day with a reflective quote. How might this alter our perspective on life? I just downloaded the app so I will let you know.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, a 40-day journey toward Easter. We mark our foreheads with dust and pray to return to God. Often Lent is doing without things – chocolate, coffee, social media. But instead of giving something up this Lent, you are invited to reflect on our expansive life with God, which is full to the brim.

A new tag line was suggested which will be voted on at the annual meeting: *Inspired by the Holy Spirit to Serve*.

Council meeting called to order 7:50 pm by Tom Karlin

A. Opening Devotions by Pastor Kathee: "Epiphany Vespers"

B. Agenda:

C. Information:

1. Pastor Kathee presented her report. Bishop Maas is ending his term early. The synod assembly delegates and Pastor will attend a Bishop Nominating meeting at St. John on Feb. 5. The noisy offerings in January will be for Oaks in memory of Pastor Don, February to the Food Pantry and March to Mother to Mother ministry.

2. Treasurer's report presented by Kodi H. Ended the year with a positive balance. Joyce H. made motion with a second from Dallen J. to approve the treasurer's report. Motion was approved.

D. Committee Reports:

Financial report – Flockbase (Accounting software) needs to be updated. Cost will be \$60.00, funds will be taken from the office budget. Nominating – three positions on nominating still open, rest of positions on ballot have been filled. Social Ministry – Looking forward to getting the new sound/video system installed. 
