SCRIPTURE LESSON

Luke 4:14-21

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone.

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

<u>FPC Art Project</u> -- The Membership Ministry is inviting you to participate in a church-wide art project of folding 1,000 origami cranes. We hope that this project will help bring a sense of community to FPC, plus give us something meditative to do in the warm indoors during the coming weeks of winter.

The tradition of folding paper cranes has been around for hundreds of years. According to Japanese custom, if a person folds 1,000 paper cranes they will be granted their most desired wish, such as a long and happy marriage, recovery from illness, or a long life. We thought we'd modify the custom slightly and invite you to write a prayer request, the name of someone you're holding in your thoughts, something you're grateful for, or anything else you find healing or meditative on the back of each sheet of paper before you fold it into your crane. Once we've collected the finished cranes, we will string them together to hang at the church—a work of prayer-and-gratitude art!

Each packet, containing ten pieces of origami paper and instructions for folding cranes, will be available to pick up in the Hartt Room at the church beginning Monday, January 24 from 9-1. When you have finished folding your cranes, please return them to the designated box in the Hartt Room. You're welcome to take additional packets if they are available. We want as many church members as possible, of all ages, to participate in the project so that it will truly be a church-wide work of art.
