

PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING

When you give to the Peace and Global Witness offering in October, 50% of the gift will support global mission projects, 25% will go to the Presbytery of Northern Kansas, and the remaining 25% will stay in the Topeka area to support the "The YWCA Center for Safety and Empowerment," formerly the YWCA Battered Women's Task Force, which provides free and confidential services to victims of domestic and sexual violence in Shawnee County. During the COVID crisis, the center has seen an increase in requests for short term housing for victims of abuse and their families. Trinity's donation through the Peace and Global Witness Offering will meet this need.

OPERATION FOOD SECURE

OPERATION FOOD SECURE is a nation-wide project to provide free food to those who need it during these difficult times. The government is buying food from the farmers that would normally go to restaurants so that it doesn't have to be discarded. It is a win-win situation for the farmers and the recipients. Trinity's Mission Committee is excited to be sponsoring the distribution in our part of the city and would like to dedicate the effort in the name of Deacon Oroke.

Unless unforeseen circumstances push the date back, we will begin food distribution in our parking lot on October 7th and then every Wednesday morning from approximately 9:30 – 11:00. We are dependent on the arrival of the food trucks so will need to be flexible. If you have to be at the church during that time, please park in the grass lot across the street from the church.

Checklist for Returning to In-Person Worship

Engage in the steps below to prepare you and your family for in-person worship.

· ·	Checklist for Church Members	
AT HOME		
	Pray for Trinity, its leaders, your family, and yourself.	
	Discuss as a family what to expect and the importance of following guidance.	
	Review any recent church communications on reopening policies and procedures.	
	Download the Sunday bulletin to your phone (or follow on-screen during service).	
	Do not leave home without your mask!	
	Visit your bathroom before heading to the church building.	
	Wash your hands right before leaving home and immediately after returning.	
ASSESS YOUR HEALTH		
	Stay home if you or one of your family members is showing signs or symptoms of an illness, especially a fever or cough.	
	Stay home if you or others you are staying with may have been exposed to someone suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19.	
	If you begin to show signs or symptoms related to COVID-19 following an in-person	
	worship service, contact your primary health provider immediately.	
UPON EXITING YOUR VEHICLE		
	Mentally prepare yourself for social distancing. Remind children and youth of what	
	this means.	
	Keep in mind that you and others will be excited to see everyone. Please wave to	
	each other, no bodily contact.	
	Put on a mask; make sure it is correctly secured around the nose and mouth.	
	Use hand sanitizer before exiting your vehicle and again before you head home.	
	Maintain social distancing as a family unit while entering and exiting the building. Provide others with their needed space.	
	Be sure to maintain social distancing in the parking lot and on sidewalks leading to the church.	
IN ENTRYWAYS	S AND HALLWAYS	
	Listen for instructions from leaders and volunteers and pay attention to signs	
	providing guidance. Maintain social distancing. Wear your mask at all times.	
	Do not congregate in the entryway, lobby, or narthex. Follow directions from ushers.	
	Be intentional with grace and patience as you, your family, and others are	
	experiencing various emotions during the new process.	
	The handicap restroom will be open only for emergencies.	
	Listen for new directives regarding collecting the offering and recording attendance.	
	The nursery, office, parlor, kitchen, fellowship hall and basement level will be closed

N THE WORSHIP SPACE	
	If you must leave the sanctuary for any reason, you will be unable to re-enter.
	Be prepared for everything to look different. Be gracious and patient as you, your family and others are dealing emotionally with the changes.
	Ushers will seat you, filling the sections from front to back. Family units must sit together. The nursery and parlor will be closed; children and youth will sit with their families.
	Please remain in your seat until you are directed to exit at the conclusion of the service.
	Wear your mask; keep it secure over your nose and mouth.
	There will be music, but the congregation will NOT sing.
	Participate as directed during responsive readings.
	Communion will not be celebrated.
	Acknowledge your friends and neighbors with a nod or wave. Pray for one another.
XITING THE	WORSHIP SPACE
	Ushers will dismiss you from your pew from back to front. Leave the sanctuary maintaining 6' between you and others. Do not stop to visit.
	The offering box will be in place at the back of the sanctuary. Place your tithes and gifts in the box and continue to exit as guided.
	Keep social distancing through the lobby and parking lot. We will not congregate after the service.
	Do not remove your mask until you have reached your vehicle.
	Sanitize your hands and wash them with soap and water when you arrive home.

On-line services will continue. Adult Sunday School is offered through Zoom. Contact the office for an invitation to attend.
