Trinity's justice ministry, Topeka JUMP, has kicked-off its 2021-2022 research cycle. Three areas will be researched.

One is a new campaign issue, Mental Health Crisis. Work will also continue in the areas of Predatory Lending and Affordable Housing. The Violence Campaign has finished its research and implementation of SAVE (Strategies Against Violence Everywhere) has started. However, JUMP continues to follow up on its progress. Below is information about each of these justice areas JUMP is pursuing.

The Mental Health Crisis Committee's research will focus on Shawnee County. The committee will work to narrow the topic and research best practice solutions. It has plans to meet with various groups that deal with this subject. These include Valeo Behavioral Health Care, Shawnee County Corrections, and Family Service and Guidance Center. These meetings will be to gather information and build relationships with those who deal with people in a mental health crisis.

JUMP's Predatory Lending Committee continues to be part of the Kansas Coalition for Payday Lending Reform. As a reminder, Kansas law allows companies to charge a much higher rate of interest than companies in states such as Colorado and Ohio. The APR in Colorado is 66.7%, in Ohio 89.58% and in Kansas 239%. These loans are meant to get people through hard times and not a debt trap. Last year, House Bill 2189 and Senate Bill 218 were introduced in the Kansas Legislature calling for payday lending reform. JUMP and the Kansas Coalition for Payday Lending will continue to push for reform with these bills.

The Affordable Housing Committee continues to seek funding for the Housing Trust Fund. Many families making less than \$40,000 a year are sleeping in cars, choosing rent over childcare and groceries or renting unsafe apartments. JUMP, along with Corner Stone of Topeka, Habitat

for Humanity, SENT, INC and others concerned with affordable housing are pushing the city to put some of the \$45 million of the American Rescue Plan money into the trust fund. The Committee also continues to work on having a dedicated source of revenue for the fund. Work toward this goal is on-going and includes meetings with the City Manager, Mayor, members of the city council and various interested community members.


