THE FIRST READING

Romans 13:8-14

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. THE HOLY GOSPEL

Matthew 18:15-20

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

THE NICENE CREED

BCP pg. 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Blessing of School Computers:

During this unprecedented time, we've all had to think outside of the box, or beyond the backpack in this instance. This Sunday, we will include a Blessing of School Computers in our service to mark the start of the virtual school year.

Did You Know?

Over the past several months, our worship service has been adapted because of COVID-19. Since March, we have been following the Liturgy of the Word but have omitted the Liturgy of the Table (also known as the Eucharist). This means we have maintained the first part of our traditional Sunday worship that includes scripture, prayers, a sermon, and the reciting of the Nicene Creed and Confession. Starting on Sunday, September 20 we will be reinstituting the Liturgy of the Table. It will be spiritual communion, meaning that Mother Nancy will consecrate and consume the elements on behalf of the congregation. This longstanding practice in the Episcopal Church has offered a means for people to receive Holy Communion spiritually when it cannot be received physically.

Save the Date!

We are looking at having an outdoor worship service on Sunday, October 4 for our annual Blessing of the Animals. This is pending approval from the diocese and adhering to the COVID-19 guidelines. We will share the specifics as we get closer, but rest assured there is a small group of people working to make this happen. Other plans for ways to connect as a congregation under COVID-19 are being evaluated and will be shared with the congregation.

Something to Know:

Mother Nancy met with other clergy and the Bishops this Wednesday on Zoom. They meet on a regular basis to worship together and discuss many different topics. This week Bishop Sutton informed the clergy that the diocese will take a more conservative approach for the number of those who can gather in churches rather than what has been outlined by the Governor's Office.
