



## THE GREAT LITANY



This was the first prayer translated into the English language in the 16th century, done at the command of Henry VIII by Thomas Cranmer for use by the English Army before an invasion of France. At first it may seem as though we have dusted off an ancient relic, but if we listen carefully, we still find ourselves in the 21st century, surrounded by temptation and evil forces in our world. It is particularly meaningful to be reminded that we are always surrounded by the witness and prayers of the faithful who have gone before us. – written by The Rev. That it may please thee to visit the lonely; to strengthen all who suffer in mind, body, and spirit; and to comfort with thy presence those who are failing and infirm, **We beseech thee to hear us, good Lord.** 

That it may please thee to support, help, and comfort all who are in danger, necessity, and tribulation,

We beseech thee to hear us, good Lord.

That it may please thee to have mercy upon all mankind, **We beseech thee to hear us, good Lord.** 

That it may please thee to give us true repentance; to forgive us all our sins, negligences, and ignorances; and to endue us with the grace of thy Holy Spirit to amend our lives according to thy holy Word,

That it may please thee to forgive our enemies, persecutors, and slanderers, and to turn their hearts,


We beseech thee to hear us, good Lord.



**Genesis** 9:8-17






#### THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD


The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.
