### THE FIRST READING

Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures. You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls. But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget

James 1:17-27

what they were like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act-they will be blessed in their doing. If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

### THE HOLY GOSPEL

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

When the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" He said to them, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines.' You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition." Then he called the crowd again and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile." For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

### THE NICENE CREED

Said by all, standing as you are able.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. ### Prayer List Update and How YOU Can Help:

Over the past month, we have been reviewing our prayer list and contacting those who request prayers for themselves, family, or friends. Thanks to the pastoral care team (Susan Boucher, Stephanie Everts, Sheila Fitzgerald, and Anne Wismer) we now have an up-to-date list of people in need of prayer. Going forward we will have two prayer lists, one for current Prayer Needs and one for Ongoing Prayer Needs. When anyone is put on the prayer list, they remain on the current Prayer Needs list for four weeks. Their name will be read aloud during the Prayers of the People on Sunday morning. During those four weeks the pastoral care team will reach out to those who submitted the names to check in and touch base. It is important as a community of faith we remain connected with those in need of prayer.

Sometimes people need prayer for a short period of time, but there are other times when there is a need for continual prayers and those names will then be added to our Ongoing Prayer Needs list. This list will be printed in the Sunday bulletin but will not be read aloud during the Prayers of the People.

This is where YOU come in. I encourage all of us to pray daily for those on both prayer lists. Read each name-silently or aloud-as you pray. The power of prayer expands well beyond the walls of our church. It reaches into every nook and cranny of our lives and gives us and others strength and comfort in ways we can't explain. All of us need "extra prayers" from time to time. Try doing this for at least one month and see what happens, I think you will be surprised! Thank you-*Mother Nancy*
