



THE FIRST READING

James 2:1-10, 11-13, 14-17

My brothers and sisters, do you with your acts of favoritism really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ? For if a person with gold rings and in fine clothes comes into your assembly, and if a poor person in dirty clothes also comes in, and if you take notice of the one wearing the fine clothes and say, "Have a seat here, please," while to the one who is poor you say, "Stand there," or, "Sit at my feet," have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor. Is it not the rich who oppress you? Is it not they who drag you into court? Is it not they who blaspheme the excellent name that was invoked over you?

You do well if you really fulfill the royal law according to the scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it. For the one who said, "You shall not commit adultery," also said, "You shall not murder." Now if you do not commit adultery but if you murder, you have become a transgressor of the law. So speak and so act as those who are to be judged by the law of liberty. For judgment will be without mercy to anyone who has shown no mercy; mercy triumphs over judgment. What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Mark 7:24-37

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice, but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophoenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go – the demon has left your daughter." So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."





Protecting God's Creation Part 2

A New Series About Sherwood's Water Management Initiative by Bronwyn Mitchell-Strong, Sherwood Hill Green Team Leader

All living things on earth rely on water. You can go a month without food, but only a couple of days without water. God has gifted us 332.5 million cubic miles of water on earth. Think of a cubic mile as a swimming pool that is one mile long, one mile wide and one mile deep. Most of the water is hiding in plain sight. 96% of the earth's water fills oceans, seas and bays. This is salt water. The remaining 2.5% is found in freshwater lakes, rivers, underground, frozen as glaciers, in the atmosphere as water vapor, and in plants and animals, including you and me.

While the volume of water on earth is fixed, it is always moving, in what we call The Water Cycle. You may remember learning about evaporation, transpiration (plant sweat), and precipitation in school. A drop of water may spend 3,000 years in the ocean before evaporating into the air as water vapor. As water vapor, it can last about 9 days before heading back down as rain, snow, sleet, or hail. If it falls as snow onto a glacier, it could stay there for hundreds of thousands of years. The oldest water found in ice was dated to 2.7 million years old. In the ground, it could last a few months before being taken up by a plant or finding its way into a secure underground aquifer.

There is no away in nature. Everything is recycled and reused. Nothing is wasted. There is no away in God either. As my mom is fond of saying, "God don't make junk."

Dinosaurs made their appearance on earth about 230 million years ago. And for about 186 million years they had a good run, until, well, you know, the asteroid. To make it all those 186 million years, (for comparison, humans have been on the earth for a measly 6 million years), those dinosaurs had to drink water, and they did. Scientists believe that every molecule of water on earth passed through the kidney of at least one dinosaur. That means that each and every glass of water we drink once was inside a dinosaur.
