WORKSHOPS - WEDNESDAY 11:00 AM - 12:15 PM

- Fear Not: Shaping Your Newsletter's Message and Getting Readers Attention This hands-on session will help participants organize their thinking and write (and edit!) articles that are clear, engaging and to the point. Using a handful of real-life scenarios, we'll write a brief article during the workshop and, if participants are brave, critique one another's work. We'll also explore some of the basics of journalism. Leader Mr. Mike Ferguson, has been editor of Presbyterian News Service since October 2018. Prior to that, he worked as a newspaper reporter for nearly three decades.
- Interwoven Generations: Living Faith Intergenerationally We are becoming super-aged and this is an opportunity for us to explore the gifts of worshipping, learning and serving as an intergenerational church. Joining hands with our peers, we will foster fellowship, mutual support, spiritual growth, community and connection while sowing new and expanded opportunities to serve our local church, community and denomination. *Leader Ms. Michele Hendrix,* is President of the Presbyterian Older Adult Ministries Network, a Deacon, Stephen Ministry Leader, Caregiver Specialist, Speaker and Trainer with expertise in Older Adult Ministry and Caregiving.
- Mission in Partnership: How Presbyterian Mission Makes a Difference Mission in the PC(USA) has evolved and changed during the last thirty years. Participants will be invited to describe the changes and challenges they have seen and experienced. Members of the Presbyterian Mission Agency staff will demonstrate and describe how partnership in mission makes a difference as it engages individuals and congregations in mission. Leaders Rev. Rosemary Mitchell, Senior Director, Mission Engagement and Support; Mr. Bryce Wiebe, Director of Special Offerings; and Mr. Bill McConnell, Mission Engagement Advisor for the South.

- Q&A with Plenary Speaker Spend time in dialogue with Rev. Jason Santos after his plenary session.
- Sunday Lift: Intergenerational Community-Building on Sunday Mornings Explore an approach to bringing generations together around the table as a new way of doing Sunday school with people of all ages. Sunday LIFT (Living In Faith Together) is a flexible model with four components (breaking bread, studying God's Word, playing, and praying) connected by a common theme. Workshop will also unpack what intergenerational ministry is and can be. Leader - Ms. Liz Perraud is Executive Director of GenOn Ministries. GenOn partners with churches to grow intergenerational Christcentered community. Liz has over 25 years of experience in the field of Christian faith formation.
- *Tips and Tricks to Better Sleep* One-third of the U.S. population (all ages) is dealing with sleep issues affecting every aspect of life. Together, we will explore common causes for insomnia, identify tips and tricks to increase the likelihood of sleeping, and practice forms of breathing, meditation and mindfulness that are known to slow down our busy brains. *Leader Ms. Jan McGilliard* holds a M.S. in Adult Development & Aging from VA Tech, is a Missional Commissioned Pastor in the Presbytery of the Peaks, and an Elder at Blacksburg Presbyterian Church. She has been involved in older adult ministries for the past 35+ years and is a past president of POAMN.
- Chaplain's Track: Chaplaincy Basics Pastoral Care with and for older adults is its own niche within chaplaincy. Come learn about the spiritual needs of this growing age cohort as well as the basics of ministry in various types of retirement homes, assisted living, skilled nursing facilities. Discuss the theology of this ministry as well as relationships between institutions and congregations. Talk about where jobs are in this area and how to seek them. Leader - Rev. Dr. Walk Jones, became Director of Church Relations for Westminster Communities of Florida in 2016. Prior to that, he was chaplain at Westminster Towers in Orlando for six years. He is a Presbyterian minister who has served churches on Edisto Island in South Carolina and in Pensacola and Apopka, Florida.

WORKSHOPS - THURSDAY 3:15 - 4:30 PM

- Collaborating to Strengthen Formation Ministries The Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA), through the office of Christian Formation has recently assembled the Christian Formation Collective by partnering with 5 associations that support age and stage Christian formation across a lifetime. POAMN is a part of this collective! Through this collective PMA is supporting and strengthening formation ministries across the denomination and throughout our churches. Hear an overview of the collective priorities and projects and gain ideas for how these organizations can support formation in your local context. Leader - Ms. Stephanie Fritz serves as the Associate Coordinator for Christian Formation at the Presbyterian Mission Agency in Louisville, KY.
- Becoming a WISE Congregation for Mental Health One in four adults lives with a diagnosable mental health condition during their lifetime, but many living with mental health challenges are reluctant to speak about it with their pastor or members of their church. Learn how your church and presbytery can become a WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) community for mental health, offering support and radical belonging for individuals of all ages living with mental health challenges, brain differences, and substance use disorders. Leader Rev. Amy Petré Hill is the Minister of Mental Health and Inclusion at Mountain View United Church in Aurora, CO, a member of the United Church of Christ Mental Health Network Board, and a participant in the PCUSA's special convocation on mental health.

WORKSHOPS - THURSDAY 3:15 - 4:30 PM (continued)

Generational Generosity - Explore shifting conversations about money in the church from stewardship to generosity by learning to tell stories of generosity. Look at the history of stewardship in the mainline church – the changes, trends, and anxieties – to understand both "where we are" and "how we got here". Explore the differences in generosity and giving of five current generations, and what opportunities might lie in the future for the church if we learn to tell stories of generosity as a witness to faith rather than continuing to talk about money from a perspective of obligation and need. Leader - Mr. Dennis Piermont After a 35-year career in Architecture and Landscape Architecture, Dennis served for ten years as the Executive Presbyter for the Presbytery of Miami Valley, overseeing more than sixty Presbyterian congregations in southwest Ohio.

WORKSHOPS - THURSDAY 4:45 - 6:00 PM

- A Lifetime of Faithful Learning (So that All May Learn and Be Encouraged, 1 Cor. 14:31) Reflect on principles of human development and faith formation and how they relate to your own adult faith formation. Explore how awareness of these principles can inform Christian education and spiritual formation within the congregation, in age/stage and intergenerational settings. Consider how incorporating multiple approaches to learning engages children of God of all ages more effectively in the process of fostering lifelong discipleship and formation. Leader - Rev. Dr. Sarah F. Erickson is a clergy member of the Presbytery of South Alabama serving as Director of Lifelong Learning at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, GA. She is committed to nurturing others through all stages of the journey of faith.
- There is No "I" in Team Leadership teams, committee members, and ministry staff are all groups that need to work together. Team building is not just something we do for youth groups. There are activities that are designed to help adult groups develop effective communication and problem-solving skills. During our time together, we will look at different exercises that help group members broaden their abilities and work together. Leader Mr. Joel Winchip, is Executive Director of the Presbyterian Church Camp and Conference Association. He also serves on the adjunct faculty of Columbia Theological Seminary, where he teaches their camp/conference ministry and recreation courses.
- What's Next? A reoccurring aspect of aging for baby boomers and seniors is the passing of their generation. As we age we want to live our senior years with enthusiasm, vitality, and even new opportunities; but we also want to be ready for the Biblically promised transition from this life to the immortality of the next. A lack of sustained Biblical teaching, and routine proclamation about this important transition has left many with an ambiguous understanding; and even fear of what will be the most important, and the upmost transition that we are all promised. It's time to have a conversation about the love of God for us not only in this life, but also the next. Leader Rev. Alyce Spells Kelly is honorably retired from pastoral ministry with the Presbyterian Church (USA) and remains a member of the Presbytery of Charlotte, NC. Her ministerial call includes releasing the Word of God in preaching and teaching, mentoring, counseling, and writing.

WORKSHOPS - FRIDAY 8:30 - 9:45 AM

- Restoring Wholeness A new small group curriculum which uses spiritual practices to explore anxiety, depression, loneliness, loss and grief, all of which are part of the human condition. When we recognize our own internal struggle with these feelings, we can be more compassionate with others who struggle with them. When we share our discoveries with others, we feel freed, connected and restored. Participants will have an opportunity to experience this new method of engaging others when addressing difficult experiences which helps maintain and restore good mental health. Leader: Rev. Kathy Dale McNair is an ordained specialized Presbyterian minister, focusing on mental health. She is the founder and creator of Restoring Wholeness, and she is on the National FaithNet Advisory Group for NAMI, the National Association on Mental Illness.
- **Prepare. Plan. Stay Posted** Disasters and emergencies from floods to fires happen without time to prepare. Participants will engage in taking commonsense measures to start preparing for emergencies before they happen. Information on advance planning; including developing a communication plan, stay or go decisions, pets, support systems, and go-kits for older adults. **Leader Ms. Beth Mary Snyder,** National Associate for Program Administration, has worked on the PC(USA) staff for 18 years, four years as Presbyterian Women program assistant and the past 14 years serving with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.
- Chaplain's Track: Chaplaincy and Spiritual Development Several writers have said that spiritual development is the main task of the second half of life. Come talk about your own spiritual development and how to help guide others. We'll look at our stories and a variety of resources including silent retreats, books, spiritual direction, and more. Leader Rev. Dr. Walk Jones, became Director of Church Relations for Westminster Communities of Florida in 2016. Prior to that, he was chaplain at Westminster Towers in Orlando for six years. He is a Presbyterian minister who has served churches on Edisto Island in South Carolina and in Pensacola and Apopka, Florida.

Tour 1: Cane Ridge Meeting House ----- (cost covers transportation and buffet dinner)



Pick up a box lunch (included with housing/meal package) and board a coach bus for a 1.75 hour ride to Cane Ridge Meeting House. Cane Ridge is a historic church building in Paris, Kentucky built in 1791. It is one of the oldest church buildings in Kentucky and the largest one room log structure. The church was the site of a large frontier Christian revival in 1801 hosted by the local Presbyterian congregation that met in the building. Upon arrival, refreshments will be available, and an overview will be given by the curator before entering into a time of worship with communion led by Mid-Kentucky Presbyter for Community Life, Rev. John Odom. The 1.75 hour trip back will include a stop for buffet dinner at Claudia Sanders (wife of the Colonel) Dinner House.

Tour 2: PC(USA) and Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory ------ & Factory) (cost covers transportation and admission fee to Slugger Museum & Factory)

ACCOMODATIONS

Accommodation costs include room and seven meals, Dinner Tuesday, October 15; Breakfast & Lunch Wednesday, October 16, Breakfast, Lunch & Banquet Thursday, October 17; and Breakfast Friday, October 18. Lodging rooms are located in Laws Lodge on the campus of Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary (LPTS), and in Legacy Hotel on the campus of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary (SBTS). Rooms at Laws Lodge are non-smoking

and furnished with 1 queen or 2 twin beds. Check in time is 3:00 PM, check out time is 11:00 AM. Rooms at Legacy Hotel are non-smoking and furnished with 1 queen size bed. Check in time is 4:00 PM, check out time is noon. Distance between Laws Lodge and Legacy Hotel is .75 mile; some transportation between the two campuses will be available by POAMN Executive Committee members and/or local volunteers. Rooms at Laws Lodge are limited and will be reserved first come first served, overflow will be assigned to Legacy Hotel. If



you wish to extend your stay in the area, you will need to secure other lodging for your additional nights. Housing is not guaranteed after September 27, 2019. Alcoholic beverages may not be served or consumed anywhere on either LPTS or SBTS campuses including all lodging rooms. AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION
