

Steward. The ZMP Board has decided to leave the auction open for 2 additional weeks for the HCOC items. These include such needs as:

- Donations toward a motor bike, needed for travel to home visits during the muddy season when a truck is not a good option. The cost is \$1,600. Any donation toward this will be helpful.
- A borehole pump and pressure pump for the new Clinic. Cost: \$1,100.
- Supplemental Feeding Program, for children who are especially malnourished. A donation of \$300 will fund this special program for 3 children for 6 months!
- Medical supplies for the Clinic. \$150 will provide

necessary supplies, medications and reusable sanitary wear for 4 orphans for 1 year.

- \$75 will provide 2 meals per day for 40 orphans for 1 month at a feeding center adjacent to one of the schools served by HCOC.

Our Guest Preacher


