SERMON MUSINGS


Luke 4:14-21

Luke tells us that, fresh from his forty-day journey into the wilderness and filled with the power of the Spirit, Jesus begins to teach in the synagogues. Coming to Nazareth, the hometown boy stands and reads from the scroll of Isaiah. From his lips flow some of the most powerful words in all of scripture:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me,
because he has anointed me
to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives
to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

Finishing his reading, Jesus rolls up the scroll, returns it to the attendant, and sits down. One can imagine him pausing for dramatic effect before he then says to his listeners, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."



On that day in the synagogue, Jesus comes among them as the sacred story of God for all to read; the ancient, sacred texts coming together and taking form...coming to life in him, for the life of the world.

And we who are the body of Christ and followers of the Word: what will we do with these words about good news for the poor, release for the captives, sight for the blind, freedom for the oppressed, and the year of God's favor? How do we, let these ancient words show up in our own lives? How do we, like the Christ whom we follow, give flesh to these words? Amid the brokenness of the world, how do we become bearers of these words that are so radical and so challenging in the hope to which they call us?

Fearless Service

We are in the midst of exploring what it means to live and give generously at Good Shepherd. We have many examples in the Bible of fearless leadership and service. The one I'm thinking about today is the Exodus story. The Israelites have been in desert wandering mode for 40 years, and they are getting impatient to arrive at this land of milk and honey. God has given them the 10 commandments to follow as a blueprint for their lives. Moses heads up Mt. Sinai to have a talk with God and leaves his people for what feels like a long time, and they get scared and feel abandoned. In his absence they make an idol out of gold - a calf - for them to worship. Of course, that action leads them to break the first two of the commandments. This is not what we would call fearless living.

How do we live fearlessly and generously when the world around us is a scary place? It's easy for us to want our own golden calves. So, we look for them...things that make us feel successful, important, and in control of our world. We don't really need a god if we have all of these things. These golden calves will make us happy; they will make us feel safe, they can be what we worship because we can see them, and they are ours.

Good Shepherd's mission statement is that the church is committed to bringing the love and teachings of Christ to our community by welcoming all, serving together, and growing in faith. It leads us in study and worship and sends us out in mission and service. To welcome, serve and grow calls us to bear witness to God's faithful compassion and presence in our lives. We have this message to give and share, and this body of Christ we call Good Shepherd Church can do that with your help. It can be the place where compassion can be found. We can be the people who share the message of God's faithfulness and love. We can be the place where we can loosen the bonds on our idols because we trust in God's providence.

So as you journey this week, think about our mission statement. Think about your own personal mission statement. Think about Moses and Aaron's experience with the Israelites when they tried or failed in sharing the message of God's compassion and presence. And as you go into your week may you find your talents enlarging the opportunities and lives of others.
