A Message from Pastor Laura...

This Advent season I'd like to share 26 ideas to help you infuse your preparations and celebrations with a sense of God's love and presence. You can follow along in order or skip around, selecting the ideas that jump out to you. Note that a few (Dec 21, 24, 25, and 26) are specific to the numbers below but otherwise the order is up to you!

May the light and love of Christ be with you!

- 1. Place a nativity set in your home—what does it tell you about Jesus' birth?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 1:4-9. Give thanks to God for someone special in your life and be in touch with them.
- 3. Wrap a present and pray for the person to whom you will give it.
- 4. Bring some greenery into your home. Amid the cold and snow of winter, what do the evergreen branches mean to you?
- 5. What do you remember about Christmas when you were a child? Pray for a child you know.
- 6. Read Psalm 85. What is one good thing in your life right now? Give thanks!
- 7. Light a candle and pray for peace in our community and in another part of the world.
- 8. Learn the true story of St. Nicholas at stnicholascenter.org
- 9. Feel the joy! Watch "Christmas Food Court Flash Mob, Hallelujah Chorus" at youtube.com
- 10. Revisit your nativity set. What do you think each of the characters felt in meeting baby Jesus?
- 11. What Christmas tradition do you find most meaningful? What does it mean to you?
- 12. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-13. Show your love for someone today.
- 13. Give yourself a break from technology today. Read, play, listen to music, or spend time with a loved one.
- 14. Read John 1:1-9. Light a candle and remember that Jesus is the Light of the World. How is he a light in your life?
- 15. Read Matthew 5:14-16. Find one way to let your light shine today.
- 16. Remember Mary and Joseph. Pray for couples expecting a child.
- 17. Remember the Innkeeper. How do you make room in your life for Jesus?
- 18. Remember the Shepherds. Who shared the good news about Jesus with you?
- 19. Remember the Magi. Pray for leaders, that they too may be wise and faithful to God.
- 20. Simeon and Anna, who recognized Jesus as Savior of the world, were advanced in age. Pray for an older member of our church.
- 21. On December 21: Spend some time outside today, giving thanks for light, even on the darkest day of the year.
- 22. Read Luke 1:46-56. Look up the words to your favorite carol (or sing them from memory). What makes this carol special to you?
- 23. Read Matthew 2:1-12. What gift would you offer to Jesus this year?
- 24. On Christmas Eve: What does it mean for you that Jesus was born?
- 25. On Christmas Day: Read Luke 2:1-20. Glorify and praise God!
- 26. Christmas isn't over—it has just begun! The Christmas season extends until January 5, and is followed by Epiphany, when we celebrate the Magi's visit to Jesus. Celebrate God's gift throughout this season!

ADULT BIBLE STUDY — Twisting the Truth

Starting December 01, 2019, we'll be discussing Twisting the Truth by Andy Stanley. "Common but deadly deceptions impact you every day. They can twist your thinking in ways you'd never expect and leave you with a life you never imagined. Your ability to recognize them can spell the difference between happiness and the loss of all you hold dear. Do you see them?

In this 6-session study, Andy Stanley exposes some common ways God's truth gets twisted. Each one has the potential to destroy your relationships, cloud your decisions, and distort your perception of him. This study helps us discover the ways the truth gets twisted in our lives and culture and, more importantly, how we can recognize and overcome them." (from the back cover of the participants guide)
