Inspired by Psalm 23, this spring you are invited to be part of the "Good Shepherd Challenge." From now through May 23, we'll have the opportunity to learn Psalm 23 by heart as a fundraiser for Resolve of Rochester. The Good Shepherd Challenge is sponsored by the Doll Tea Party Committee, Christian Education Committee, and Spiritual Discipleship. We are offering two ways to participate—**you are welcome to choose one or both.**

Option 1: Learn Psalm 23 by heart in the translation of your choice—sign up at <u>https://www.eventbrite.com/e/good-shepherd-challenge-tickets-151691026945</u>

to let us know you are planning to participate. Kids can learn the psalm with a special children's booklet version. This booklet will be mailed to families in the church and is available in the narthex. When you have the psalm memorized, email Pastor Laura (<u>pastor@perintonpres.org</u>) or call her (223-1203). You won't have to recite it—we will trust your word on this.

Option 2: Be a Good Shepherd Sponsor by committing to donate \$1 for every person at PPC who learns the psalm by heart. On May 23, we will let you know the total number of people who completed the challenge, with donations payable to PPC with the memo: "Resolve" by May 31. When you sign up with Cyndi, you may indicate the maximum number of people you are willing to sponsor or if you prefer a specific total of \$25, \$50, \$75, \$100, etc.

More on Resolve of Rochester:

For over a decade our church has sponsored a Doll Tea Party each spring to raise funds for RESOLVE, a non-residential resource and support center for women and children rebuilding their lives after domestic abuse and violence. Since opening in 1998, they have served over 2,500 women. Services include safety planning, individual counseling, community resource coordination, resettlement support, lifeskills training, teen violence/ abuse prevention education, and more.

Session met twice in April, for our regular meeting on April 12, and for a special meeting dedicated to conversation about the land in the church's care on April 28.

Session discussion and decisions this month include the following items:

- Examination of new elders and deacons. This is one of session's responsibilities each year according to our PCUSA Constitution Part II, *The Book of Order*. This examination follows a period of preparation for leadership in the church and provides an opportunity for current session members to hear from each candidate about his or her faith journey, sense of call, and special gifts for ministry.
- Updates from our COVID Response Team, agreeing on current attendance in worship of 50 people plus the Worship and Tech Teams and for Services of Witness to the Resurrection (funerals), a total of 75 people, plus the Worship and Tech Teams.
- Youth Elder Jackson Dietz led us in a first reading of a Church Safety Plan and we discussed soliciting volunteers from the congregation for an "Emergency Response Team."
- Upon recommendation of the Finance Committee and Stewardship Committee, session voted to
 move to a unified church budget for 2022, combining the current "Building" and "Operating
 Funds" into one church budget. In the past decade or so a number of churches in our area have
 successfully combined separate church funds to create a unified budget for the sake of simplicity
 and streamlining operations. Finance, Stewardship, and Session believe that the time is right for
 PPC to make this update as well and the vote passed unanimously.

Mission Spotlight



Perinton Congregations for Flower City Habitat for Humanity is a coalition of thirteen Perinton Congregations of which Perinton Presbyterian Church is a significant partner. We are just one of several faith-based groups in Perinton that provides financial support and recruits volunteers to help build homes for Flower City Habitat for Humanity, a non-denominational Christian housing ministry welcoming people of all faiths or no faith to help eliminate substandard and poverty housing in Rochester.

To date, Perinton Congregations for Flower City Habitat for Humanity has sponsored the build of seven houses within the city of Rochester since 1998. The last house was built in 2017. We sponsor the build of a house every third year. We were scheduled to build our 8th house in 2020, However, due to COVID, we had to postpone until 2021.

Flower City Habitat for Humanity plans to build four new homes and rehab two vacant or abandoned houses in 2021. The <u>Perinton Congregation Coalition</u> build will be a single-story house with accessibility located at 871 Smith Street, less than a half-mile from School 17. The homebuyer is Francesca Madera, a single mother who has participated in the Homeward Bound and Home Buyer programs. **The groundbreaking ceremony is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, June 12.** The probable start date is the first week of July and the building is expected to last about six months. Volunteer days will begin shortly after the dig and will be two days a week starting and increase to three or four in the fall. Ages 16 and up are welcomed!
