Although there was no regular session meeting in July, we did gather for a special session meeting on Monday, July 26, to receive the report of our Website Team. After 4 months of research, learning, and conversations with possible web developers, the team was ready

to make a proposal to session, as we prepare to create a new website for PPC. As part of this work we learned that organizations like ours tend to fully redevelop their websites every 3-5 years. While weekly, and sometimes daily updates, are part of staying current, these major revisioning projects help organizations stay current with new technology and present their ministries in the most dynamic and up-to-date ways.

Session unanimously approved the project, which will be funded through our outreach budget, and the team is excited for work to begin. They will be meeting weekly with the web developers at Worship Times to create content that will engage visitors and inspire them to connect with the congregation. We're excited for this project and are grateful to Kristin Cuccia, Paul Girouard, Kurt Prister, Sonya Verrillo, Beth Farrar, and Jill Bazer for being part of this team!

Session's Next Meeting is scheduled for August 3, 2021. At this meeting we'll be discussing a draft of PPC's Core Worship Values, developed by our Worship Values Team; we're also hoping to finalize worship times for the fall and will share those very soon.

The last year has been tricky because of COVID but we are looking forward to returning to these wonderful church opportunities.


General Information
