

#### Dear PPC,

The cover of a recent edition of *Christianity Today* displayed the words..."Empty Pews Are an American Public Health Crisis." Intrigued, I turned to the article, written by researchers from the Harvard School of Public Health and the Human Flourishing Program.

The story explores the concrete physical and mental health impact of regularly attending worship services. The statistics are remarkable:



What stands out to me most about this data is that the health benefits are so dramatically tied to being together IN PERSON. The authors write, "It is specifically religious service attendance, rather than private practice or self-assessed religiosity or spirituality, that most powerfully predicts health."

As COVID persists, each of us is weighing the risks of worshipping in person or online, or perhaps not at all. What this research demonstrates is that coming IN PERSON to worship can dramatically IMPROVE our health. There is some risk, as with going to the grocery store or restaurants or getting together with friends YET there are demonstrated health benefits too! So along with all those healthy eating/exercise resolutions, coming to church can be a powerful healthy choice for 2022.

Our December 7 session meeting included the following conversations and decisions:

- Meeting with the Feadan Or Pipe Band, regarding a request to use PPC space for their weekly rehearsals on Tuesday nights. - Authorized the updating of our church rolls, including a vote to receive new member Carol Roth by letter of transfer. We look forward to formally welcoming Carol to membership in January.
- Ratified the decision to charter Cub Scout Pack 273.
- Discussed preliminary ideas regarding updates to the church narthex in 2022.
- Discussed nominations for the 2022 Nominating Committee.
- Received an update on the year end giving challenge and received the October Financial Report.
- Received an update on refugee support with World Relief of Western New York.
- Discussed a winter deacon-elder retreat.
- Authorized church office closures for 2022.
- Approved the 2022 budget.
- Voted to recommend pastor's terms of call for 2022 to the congregation.

# Greetings from Facilities,

Tom Force and I wanted to share with you what has been going on with Facilities 2021.

\*Please note the numbers have been rounded off to the nearest whole number\*

### Approximately 1550 volunteer hours for 2021.

\* These hours include building and grounds maintenance and repair. Everything from changing light bulbs, to clearing hiking trails, to gutter cleaning/repair, to paint and drywall, to repair and running new electric where needed. Also included is: Equipment maintenance and repair, outside vendor logistics, AV upgrades and operation. Including all prep and broadcast time for services, research and planning for improvements...etc.

Facilities volunteer money spent, not asked for reimbursement: Approximately \$827.00

# <u>Facilities estimated money saved thanks to Team Facilities volunteers: Approximately \$77,500.00</u>

(Money saved is based on \$50 per hour x 1550 of volunteer time)

# **Lunch with Pastor Laura!**



you would like to participate. The books are available now through Lisa. The book is from the Spirit-Filled Life Bible Discovery Guides Series. Description from back cover: For many Christians, the Minor Prophets can seem distant and incomprehensible. *Twelve Voices for Truth* shows how these ancient prophets still speak to believers today. By exploring each book's theme in the context of history and revelation, you'll learn how the prophets speak to you today. Though the books are minor in length, they are major in the truths they teach, including the majesty of God, courage and hope, injustice and judgment, trusting and loving God, and many other spiritual precepts. This study helps you discover Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi. You will focus study time in the Word and get practical insight into people and places of biblical times. Truths for daily living will be revealed and will provide a source for gaining a good understanding of the Bible and how to see its themes and counsel applied.
