Dear Health Licensure Board Chairs and Members:

The Tennessee Division of Health Related Boards and the Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) are committed to protecting the health, safety and welfare of the public. The Department fully understands the risk of transmission of COVID-19 and other respiratory illnesses that providing healthcare services poses to patients, staff and licensees and is working closely with the Office of the Governor, TDH, and additional state agencies to ensure licensees have the information and guidance they need to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Due to the developing nature of this public health event, the Department is monitoring regulatory issues that may affect our licensees as they manage the COVID-19 crisis. We will update this information as we learn more details from the Governor's Office, other state agencies and the CDC.
