How should congregations handle funerals in this time of social distancing? The PC(USA) Office of Theology and Worship sought guidance from Thomas G. Long, author of *Accompany Them with Singing: The Christian Funeral* and *The Good Funeral: Death, Grief, and the Community of Care* (with Thomas Lynch), and provides the following guidelines based on his response. At the time of death, have a very small group of family accompany the body/ashes to the place of interment. Once people are gathering in public again, have a memorial service that begins with recounting the story of the earlier interment. The body of the deceased is honored and accompanied; concerns about public health are met; and there will one day be a time for a wider, public witness to the resurrection.
