# Forming & Celebrating Generous Households During (and after) a Pandemic

The three-fold goal of **The Generosity Project**: *Connect generations, Equip households, and Create Centers for the Faith Practice of Generosity.* 

As synod and congregational leaders, we know all too well that due to COVID-19, the way we approach ministry is unlike anything we have experienced before. We will never conduct ministry, or The Generosity Project, in the same way again. In fact, we have had to "pivot," and adapt and adopt new digital tools and resources for ministry. How do we cease this moment in history and ministry to consider new, unending possibilities?

Prior to COVID-19 the cornerstone of The Generosity Project was "Connecting Generations" and the face-to-face, lively interactions between those ages 2-102. Although gathering in person has been disrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic; reaching out and connecting with households is now a prime objective in all of our ministries. The Generosity Project's focus on equipping households and creating centers for the faith practice of generosity has become more relevant than ever.

Sheltering in place, staying home, family members, households, income, budgets, financial strain, financial security, and financial disparity have all become familiar words and topics in the news and our daily conversations. Our society has changed forever – there is no going back. Let us, then, not approach stewardship in the same, familiar ways. Instead, let us focus on creating a lasting culture of effective financial stewardship and generosity, beginning with our households – whatever age and stage of life they represent.

As you continue to pivot and plan your ministry emphasis on Stewardship and Discipleship in these uncertain times, consider adapting and utilizing The Generosity Project resources in three ways, now and into the future:<sup>1</sup>

1. Delivery to Individuals and households online 2. Online small groups (council, ministry team leaders, generational cohorts) 3. Physical face-to-face gatherings.

### For Church Councils, Stewardship, Discipleship, Christian Ed Team Leaders:

Consider using the following resources for personal and small group study in preparation for creating a culture of generosity in one's congregation and households.

- **TGP: Welcome** Introduction, overview and history of The Generosity Project
- TGP: Foundation and Fundamentals A summary of the basic faith practices, research and Lutheran understanding of baptism and ELCA's Five Gifts of Discipleship that ground a multi-generational, household approach to stewardship and discipleship.
  - Pay particular attention to the section that explains the need for equipping households.
  - The concluding list of questions is yeast for rich conversation for your leaders, via online or in person.
- TGP: Annotated Bibliography A list of books, web sites, articles, financial education, workshops, phone apps, and research for planning teams and households – anyone who desires to go deeper and extend the focus of generosity into practices of faith and a year-round way-of-living

- How can your congregation use the abundant digital platforms or the telephone, to connect generations for conversation in response to the TGP questions related to God's Story and one's personal money story, consumerism, and practice of generosity?
- How could you duplicate what All Saints Lutheran, Phoenix, AZ accomplished Fall 2019 with The Generosity Challenge?
