THE PSALM

Psalm 147:1-13

Alleluia! How good it is to sing praises to you, O God;* how pleasant it is to honor you with praise! For you rebuild Jerusalem * and gather the exiles of Israel. You heal the brokenhearted * and bind up their wounds. You count the number of the stars * and call them all by their names. Great are you and mighty in power; * there is no limit to your wisdom. You lift up the lowly, * but cast the wicked to the ground. We sing to you, Most High, with thanksgiving; * we make music to you upon the harp, For you cover the heavens with clouds * and prepare rain for the earth; You make grass to grow upon the mountains * and green plants to serve mankind. You provide food for flocks and herds * and for the young ravens when they cry. You are not impressed by the might of a horse; * you have no pleasure in human strength; But you have pleasure in those who fear you, * in those who await your gracious favor. Jerusalem will worship you, O GOD,* and Zion will praise your name.

THE GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 2:22-40

When the time came for their ritual cleansing, in accordance with the Law from Moses, they brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (It's written in the Law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male will be dedicated to the Lord.") They offered a sacrifice in keeping with what's stated in the Law of the Lord,

A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.

A man named Simeon was in Jerusalem. He was righteous and devout. He eagerly anticipated the restoration of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. The Holy Spirit revealed to him that he wouldn't die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Led by the Spirit, he went into the temple area. Meanwhile,

Jesus' parents brought the child to the temple so that they could do what was customary under the Law. Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God. He said,

"Now, master, let your servant go in peace according to your word,

because my eyes have seen your salvation.

You prepared this salvation in the presence of all peoples.

It's a light for revelation to the Gentiles

and a glory for your people Israel."

His father and mother were amazed by what was said about him. Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "This boy is assigned to be the cause of the falling and rising of many in Israel and to be a sign that generates opposition so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your innermost being too."

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, who belonged to the tribe of Asher. She was very old. After she married, she lived with her husband for seven years. She was now an 84-year-old widow. She never left the temple area but worshipped God with fasting and prayer night and day. She approached at that very moment and began to praise God and to speak about Jesus to everyone who was looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

When Mary and Joseph had completed everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to their hometown, Nazareth in Galilee. The child grew up and became strong. He was filled with wisdom, and God's favor was on him.

REFLECT

- 1. Notice the characters in this story. For each character, imagine what emotions they might be feeling. Which character(s) do you relate to most–Mary, Joseph, Simeon, or Anna?
- 2. The text says that Simeon was "moved by the Spirit" (v. 27). Have you ever felt "moved by the Spirit?" What does that look like for you?
- 3. Both Anna and Simeon publicly display their faith, telling all who will listen about Jesus and their dreams for Jerusalem's future. What things do you speak up about? What are things you have remained silent about? What prevents you from speaking?
- 4. Who in your life has been an Anna and Simeon for you? What did they speak about, and how did their profession change you?
- 5. Finally, focus on the "now what"? What is your takeaway from the story? What are you charged to do, think, or feel?

JOIN THE CONVERSATION-REFLECTIVE PRAYER

To practice speaking aloud our dreams for this world, we invite you to write four things on Post-It Notes, following these prompts:

- 1. Anna and Simeon begin speaking by praising God. Write something that you are grateful for—a piece of good news worthy of praise.
- 2. Anna and Simeon have dreams for a better world. Write a dream you have for the world that we need to speak about.

- 3. Anna and Simeon speak and are heard, but not all people are listened to with the same equality in our world. Think of one person or group of people that are speaking, but are not being heard. May this be a reminder that we can use our voices for and alongside others.
- 4. In the face of old age and weariness, Anna and Simeon made joy their resistance. What is your dream and/or prayer for yourself?

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Holy Dreamer,

When they saw Jesus, Anna and Simeon spoke your praise. In this time, we now lift our own prayers of gratitude and praise: *Speak your prayers aloud, or type them into the chat.*

Holy Dreamer,

Anna and Simeon had dreams for a better world. We, too, have these dreams—and we won't keep silent about them. We now offer our dreams to you: *Speak your prayers aloud, or type them into the chat.*

Holy Dreamer,

When Anna and Simeon speak, their voices are heard and what they say is received with reverence. Yet, we live in a world where not all voices are heard—instead, many are silenced. We now lift our prayers for those whose voices are silenced or muted: *Speak your prayers aloud, or type them into the chat.*

Holy Dreamer,

When faced with the principalities and powers of oppression, Mary, Elizabeth, Anna, and Simeon, made joy their resistance. We ask that you would give us the joy of your salvation that we might be harbingers of peace. Speak your prayers aloud, or type them into the chat.

Holy God, we lift all these prayers, written and unwritten, spoken and unspoken, to you. Hold them with care. Give them life. Breathe your grace into them and make all things new. Amen.
