EPIPHANY

Epiphany ("manifestation" or "revelation") is the third season of the church year and lasts until Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Epiphany marks the manifestation of Jesus to the Gentiles (represented by the magi) and reminds us that while Jesus was a Jew and spoke largely to Jewish crowds during his life on Earth, he came to bring peace and restoration to all people. If Christmas is about the birth of Jesus, then Epiphany is about the spread of the good news to the wider world. During this season we focus our lives on a world transformed by God's incarnational presence in Jesus. The liturgical color is green, representing the green things of God's earth and referring to growth of the spirit of God within us in response to His coming at Christmas.

THE OLD TESTAMENT

Isaiah 43:1-7

In the second half of the book of Isaiah, the prophet proclaims a message of consolation and encouragement.

But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, "Give them up," and to the south, "Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the eartheveryone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." THE PSALM Psalm 29

Psalm 29 is a hymn to Yahweh as the God of storm. It may have been written as an objection to the pagan assertion of Baal as the thunder-god. Yahweh is the source of strength and blessing for the people.

- 1 Ascribe to GOD, you heavenly beings, * ascribe to GOD glory and strength.
- 2 Ascribe due honor to GOD'S holy Name; * worship the MOST HIGH in the beauty of holiness.
- 3 The voice of GOD is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders; * GOD is upon the mighty waters.
- 4 The voice of GOD is a powerful voice; * the voice of GOD is a voice of splendor.
- 5 The voice of GOD breaks the cedar trees; * GOD breaks the cedars of Lebanon;
- 6 GOD makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.

7 The voice of GOD splits the flames of fire; the voice of GOD shakes the wilderness; * GOD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

8 The voice of GOD makes the oak trees writhe and strips the forests bare.

- 9 And in the temple of the HOLY ONE, all are crying, "Glory!"
- 10 GOD sits enthroned above the flood; enthroned as Sovereign for evermore.
- 11 GOD shall give strength to us; * GOD shall give us the blessing of peace.

+THE GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

As Jesus was (in Luke often a prelude to major events) the Holy Spirit descends. With the title formerly applied to the nation, to the king, and later to the Messiah, Jesus is now openly called the Son of God, dramatizing and confirming what was implicit in his conception (1:35). Thus, Jesus is anointed for his mission.

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

WE RESPOND TO GOD

+AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: THE NICENE CREED

The Nicene Creed, the Church's central statement of faith, emerged out of the first four councils of the Church in the 4th century in response to controversies about Jesus' divinity. The Latin root of the phrase "we believe" (credo) means to "give one's heart." The creed is our way of affirming to the foundation to which we orient our hearts and lives. The term "apostolic" refers to the historic succession of the apostles (original leaders of the early church) through our bishops. The term "catholic" refers to the universal church throughout the world.

OfficiantLet us affirm our faith in the One, holy, and living God:AllWe believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen
and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
