Associate General Presbyter—Nancy Meehan Yao


We are living into the "new normal"- and whatever that looks like for you, I am pretty sure it will still involve masks, physical distancing, and frequent, 20 seconds of handwashing. We let go of some stuff this past year (blowing out birthday candles, hugs from our grandkids) and have adopted other practices: curbside pickup of groceries, perhaps more outside exercise, or a zoom yoga class.

We have made changes in being church, as well: zoom worship, online giving instead of passing the plate, the passing of the peace with a wave or an elbow bump instead of a handshake or hug, virtual communion instead of in the pews. Now is a good time to think about what we have lost, and what we have gained, this past year. What new practices do you want to continue? What old practices/ behaviors do you hope to revive? How likely are you to do either?



Hank Green has made up this handy chart below. Things near the top are things you want to go back to/take up again (hugging your grandchildren). Things near the bottom are new things you want to keep doing: more frequent handwashing, or ordering dinner on your phone. The left and right axis shows how likely (or not) you think it will be that you will actually do this. So, for example, singing hymns, together, might be something you want very much to resume, (so it will be toward the top of the chart) but it will probably not happen anytime soon, given the guidelines from the CDC, so it will be more towards the left of the chart—for now. This chart can be a way for us to think about, and to discuss, changes and behaviors in our personal lives, and in the church. Use it with your Session, and see what good conversation will flow out of this activity! This conversation will be not just about behaviors, but will be a spiritual conversation—because the life we live, as a community of faith, is always prompted by, and breathed into, the Spirit of God. What is God prompting you to keep, and what to get rid of?




Incarnation as Adaptive Change

Pentecost Special Offering—May 23, 2021

Pentecost is one of four Special Offerings connected to a season of the church year and mandated by the General Assembly to help the whole Church join together in response to God's grace.

See the fliers for all four of the Special Offerings at https://specialofferings.pcusa.org/.

Congregations collect contributions for this Special Offering of Pentecost on Pentecost Sunday. This is a way to celebrate the Holy Spirt and the birth of the church.

40% of the Pentecost offering collected at the church level is to be kept at the local church level. This is to help churches support their local child and youth ministry. The Pentecost Leader Guide shows us that congregations are inspired to assist families of children at risk, support education for at-risk youth, growing mission work with youth and young adults, ministering to at-risk children and teens, and providing for health and safety. Go to pcusa.org/Pentecost for more detailed information.

Congregations then send the remaining 60% of the funds collected to the presbytery. The contributions collected from all the Shenandoah Presbytery churches are then sent to the denomination. The PCUSA uses your generous offering to support the Young Adult Volunteers (25%), Youth Ministries (25%) and Child Advocacy (10%).
