8 Habits of Evangelism #2 WORSHIP

While every congregation engages in worship (it's what we do), worship also prepares us, empowers us, and shapes us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. We come in, to be sent out.

But in this time of pandemic, the whole scheme of "coming in" to worship has been disrupted. We have had to re-examine the ways we worship, and many of us have found that people who would not come in to worship with us, now join us in online or recorded worship experiences. While we might struggle with the type of worship we are most comfortable with, if we are to reimagine what evangelism calls us to do, we need to be open to other ways of worship. This may be a new form of evangelism for us.



Here (from Bruce Reyes-Chow) are some thoughts:

We need to Reimagine, rather than replicate. When using online techniques for worship, use the advantages online technology can give you to share the Good News. Online does not have to replicate identically what happens in physical worship, and by the same token, technology may be used to enhance in-person worship (video clips, messages from members who cannot be physically present, etc.)

Add more seats to the table. More people, and more different people, can now be part of worship. All ages, voices, and people, even those physically different, can now be present in worship, and can help to lead the service.

Think of yourself as a DJ. As worship leaders, we create the worship environment. This still applies in online worship as well. WE can choose from a variety of worship element, experiment- and even have fun. This is a way to incorporate new elements that might not have been used previously in physical, sanctuary based worship.

Some questions for discussion:

What have you lost? What have you gained, in this shift in worship during the past 2 years? What have you learned about yourself, your congregation, and the community in which you reside? What worship practices might God be revealing to you and your congregation?

Freeing Congregational Mission



by Hunter Farrell and S. Balajiedlang Khyllep

In Freeing Congregational Mission, Farrell and Khyllep help congregations examine mission practices, moving from harmful cultural lenses and assumptions, so churches can better partner with God's mission and work in the world.

The authors focus on:

A Christ centered theology of mission rooted in companionship An approach to engage across differences with cultural humility

Insights and strategies to accompany local and global neighbors in co-development.

Farrell and Khyllep say that these 3 core elements and orientations are the 3 foundational "stones" upon which mission must rest.

Included in the book are tools to help congregations, mission teams, leaders and participants to reflect on their current practice and assumptions, and to grow in each of the 3 core areas.

Farrell is Director of Pittsburgh Theological Seminary's World Mission Initiative, and Khyllep is Associate Director.

Two Sundays in January were designated for the offering which received \$1,185, and then was matched by an equal amount by the session from the church's general fund, for total gift check to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance of the P.C. Did you know?

...the Board of Pensions, through Board University e-courses, offers a course in Clergy Taxes?

This course helps you better understand the tax laws unique to ministers. You will learn about dual tax status, selfemployment tax, housing allowance, imputed income, accountable reimbursement plans, and considerations when hiring a tax advisor. This course will provide you with tax worksheets and reference resources that will help in preparing your tax return.

Also, the Board of Pensions offers clergy tax help through the EAP (Employee Assistance Program) for those enrolled in the Board of Pensions, either in Pastor's Participation or Minister's Choice programs:

Financial and legal assistance

Financial consultation: a 30-minute telephone consultation with a qualified specialist on issues such as debt counseling, retirement planning, tax planning, clergy tax issues, budgeting, and college funding

Legal consultation: a 30-minute telephone or face-to-face consultation with a participating attorney

Identity theft assistance: a 60-minute consultation with a fraud resolution specialist

Tax assistance: a 25 percent discount on regular tax preparation services
