

LCR ended the month of July \$11,000 unfavorable to budget, which brings us to \$11,600 unfavorable to budget the two months ending July. I give thanks to God for this blessing, and for your continued commitment to LCR.

Items needed: Dry beans and grains, tortillas, canned meats, vegetables and fruit, pasta and pasta sauces, household paper goods, detergents and personal hygiene items.

YELLS-Food Distribution Program Update



Over the past two months one of LCR's supported ministries, YELLS, in cooperation with Food Security for America and the Franklin Road Community Association, has been distributing groceries every other

week to families in need on the Franklin Gateway.

YELLS-Youth Empowerment through Learning, Leading, and Serving, provides youth in the Franklin Gateway community of Marietta with marketable skills, support and opportunities, inspiring them to invest in themselves, their education and their communities.

With continuing financial contributions, the number of families served with food has grown to over 25 which is 10 more families (40% increase) than the first distribution. Also, the amount of groceries has grown to an average of over 120 pounds per family as opposed to the original 50 pounds. That is a total of over 3,000 pounds of food assistance every two weeks.

Families served include those who have been directly affected by illness or loss or reduction of employment due to the pandemic.
