#### God and the Pandemic—Part 2

Some of us at LCR are gathering on zoom Tuesday evenings to discuss NT Wright's book "God and the Pandemic". Last week we focused not on the "Why?" question – Why do bad things like the pandemic happen, but rather the "What?" question - What can we do to build the Kingdom of God in the midst of things like the pandemic?

This past week we focused our conversation in two areas. First, Wright makes the comment "Actions have consequences. So does inaction." What we do, how we treat people, how we care for the world God entrusted to us matters. And when we don't live as God is inviting us to live, pain and heartache and hurt result. So pay attention to how you live this week. Don't add to the heartache of the world; do something to heal it.

Which then got us into a conversation about Jesus and how He lived and what His purpose in life was all about. And a question we are were to think about this week was – Who has been a Jesus figure in your life and why? Who has been the personification of Jesus for you? Because in today's world, Jesus is made known to us through ordinary people – people named Bill and Alice and Jack and Karen.

It's a question perhaps each one of us would do well to ask. Not only the "Who?" question but the "Why?" question. Why does so and so remind you of Jesus? And how would the world be different and better if each of us lived that way? So the question "Who has been a Jesus figure for you?" leads to an even more important question - "Who would think of you as being a Jesus figure for them?" I have this feeling that if more and more people started naming you as a Jesus figure for them, this world would be a better place in which to live. -Pastor Dave 2

YELLS UPDATE Youth Empowering through Learning, Leading, and Serving

COVID-19 Response: YELLS has worked collaboratively to pivot and re-vision their services to meet the changing needs of their community during this time. These efforts include:

Daily virtual educational and social-emotional programming for youth and teens to support digital learning and provide coping skills, opportunities for community-building, and individual tutoring. (44 individual youth)

Rental assistance payments for families facing financial challenges. This includes rent and extended-stay motel payments for 6 families (17 individual family members impacted).

A new partnership with Food Security for America to provide fresh groceries to 30 families biweekly, totaling 12,168 pounds of food. This new program relies on our strong partnership with the Franklin Road

Community Association who helped us mobilize Franklin Gateway neighbors as the volunteers to make this possible by unloading, sorting, and distributing the food baskets in our drive-thru event every two weeks. (30 families, 105 individuals)



Providing school and activity supplies to families regularly through drop-off packages, including books donated by a local teacher.

#### GUATEMALA VIRTUAL GALA A HUGE SUCCESS

Last Friday the Guatemala Gala was held online, on the Synod website and YouTube. Based on the amount of views recorded by the Synod, it was a huge success: to date, 789 views of the Gala have been counted. That, based on viewership estimates, means that over 1,800 people from across the Southeastern Synod and the nation took part in the proceedings.

As might be imagined, the total amount of donations to the ministries of our Partner Synod, Iglesia Luterana Agustina de Guatemala (ILAG), is still being counted. ILAG, and especially, the Congregation Santisima Trinidad and MILAGRO, the school for young Mayan women, are closely tied to LCR. They have been companions in ministry for the past several years and are supported, in part, by our congregation, financially, with frequent visits, and in our prayers.
