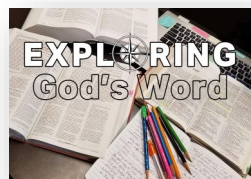

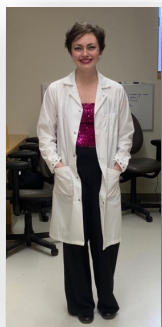

Hope and Healing During the Pandemic

Isabel Ott was formed in faith at LCR and after graduating High School in 2015 she has gone on to develop the gifts God has given her at UGA and Yale. She is using those gifts for the sake of all of her neighbors in need during the Pandemic. Recently Isabel published her first lead author paper in the CDC's Emerging Infectious Diseases Journal. We are all really proud of her.

Isabel Ott joined the Grubaugh lab at Yale University to focus on Covid research in 2020. While she will tell you she's "just a lab rat" (assistant), she has contributed to the development of SalivaDirect, a non-swab Covid 19 test, funded in part by collaboration with the NBA. SalivaDx was designed to be an open-source, uncommercialized protocol, with no kit required, in an effort to make it accessible to labs across the country. It has received accolades since it was introduced.

Many hours of research have produced papers published in Cell, Nature Microbiology, and New England Journal of Medicine, to which Isabel contributed and is cited. Most recently, she published her first lead author paper in the CDC's Emerging Infectious Diseases Journal, a childhood goal of hers. While the workload has been exhausting, Isabel is grateful to be exactly where God needs to use her right now. You can read her paper [here](#).

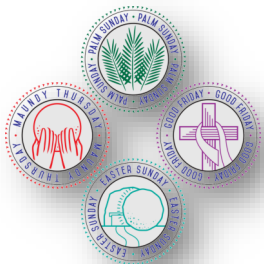
