**Good Friday**— at noon and 7:00 pm Parking Lot Worship, we'll gather in silence and recall Jesus' death on the cross, on the day when he died on the cross.

GOOD FRIDAY Online worship available at noon.



Holy Saturday— from 10 am to noon and from 2:00-4:00 pm we ask you to bring flowers to LCR to decorate the Easter Cross in preparation of Easter Sunday.

During these time windows (10-noon, 2-4), we also invite you to stay and paint rocks with messages of healing and hope. Once your rocks are dry, we challenge you to place them in unexpected locations around your community. Event will be family and Covid friendly. In the event of rain, we will package supplies in kits for painting at home.





Easter Sunday— at 8:00 am, 9:30 am, and 11:00 am Parking Lot Worship—just like the women who went to the tomb early on the first day of the week (Sunday), we'll do the same and hear the good news just like they did.


Sunday 2020, but this was delayed due to the Pandemic. We are excited to mark this occasion with them today.

# **Council Update**

Hello LCR members & friends,

We continue to have lots to be thankful for at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection. We are in a solid financial position, and we give thanks to God for that! Nine months into the fiscal year, total offerings and facility rental income are \$20,082 below budget, yet our "bottom line" net income is

\$10,841 favorable to budget. This is largely due to expense reductions due to not having in-person worship and activities.

Worship continues to be a vibrant part of LCR, with attendance across the various forms of worship consistently strong. The number of "hits" for virtual worship has dipped over the past few weeks, and parking lot worship over the past six weeks has increased to 140 people per week.

This past Sunday was Consecration Sunday for our 2021 Christian Response Campaign. If you have not turned in your financial pledge commitment card, I would ask that you prayerfully consider doing so. This is a very important part of helping LCR to achieve our Long-Range plan vision and carry out God's mission in this world.

In January, your Council approved the creation of a Youth Ministries Task Team to evaluate options for LCR's Youth Ministries Space. During our March Council meeting, your Council unanimously approved the Task Team's recommendation to make the Pavilion a space primarily for youth, as well as their recommendations for renovations to the Pavilion. This is exciting news as we invest in the Youth of our congregation! Stay tuned for more details.

Lastly, please note that our Annual meeting is scheduled for Sunday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, and we will have a Town Hall on Sunday, April 25<sup>th</sup>. During our Annual meeting, we will conduct some important business for our congregation, including approval of new council members, and the approval of the upcoming fiscal year budget. The Town Hall will be a great opportunity for you to learn more and ask questions about these items. Both meetings will be conducted via Zoom.
