# **Fundraising**

#### Youth

Council has determined that the Pavilion is going to be the dedicated new home for LCR Youth Ministry and has allocated significant funds to spend on safety and maintenance (HVAC with UV light disinfection module, tree removal, gutters/ drainage issues, siding, windows, etc.) and also on interior renovations (painting, flooring, couches, storage, etc.). In addition, 2 Boy Scouts will be working on their Eagle Scout projects to enhance the Pavilion. Sam Thornton is adding a fire pit, and AJ Evangelista will be installing a volleyball court.

Council has asked LCR Youth Ministries to help to fund the project through fundraising. Our target is \$3,000 (about the cost of couches and interior painting). We secured a matching gift of \$1,500 from a generous family in the congregation! So, we could potentially raise \$4,500! Bring your fundraising ideas to Pastor Stephen and be on the lookout to support our youth in their fundraising efforts. - Pastor Stephen
