Jerry Weyrauch honored with Robert S. and Jean E. Graetz Advocacy Award



Jerry Weyrauch was awarded the Graetz Advocacy Award in honor of his courage and faithfulness to the Gospel, in being a faithful advocate for Suicide Prevention and Awareness in the ELCA SE Synod and across the ELCA.

In 1987 Jerry and Elsie Weyrauch's oldest daughter, Dr. Terri Weyrauch, died by suicide at the age of 34. Their daughter's death began a journey in suicide prevention. Jerry and Elsie volunteered in the Atlanta area helping suicide survivors and raising money for research and set about educating themselves and learning that 132 people die by suicide every day in the United States, over 48,000 per year, that there are more suicides than homicides. They made it their ministry to develop a national suicide prevention strategy and founded the Suicide Prevention Advocacy Network in 1986. Jerry and Elsie mobilized thousands across the country to lobby for suicide prevention measures and assisted in the adoption of the ELCA's Social Statement of Suicide Prevention in 1999.

After Elsie's death, Jerry continued to work tirelessly to equip, engage and empower people in this work, most recently by encouraging Rostered Leaders of the ELCA Southeastern Synod to train in the QPR Suicide Prevention Model.

Step off the Curb: Active Bystander Intervention Workshop

Do you find it uncomfortable when you witness harm between people in public or even at your dining room table? Do you wonder what you should do? Stay silent? Speak up? Pretend it's not happening? Walk away? Get help? Intervene?

The Bible is filled with stories of people who "got involved" when they witnessed harmful situations. Verbal abuse, harassment, racist comments, bullying behavior.

First United Lutheran Church will host a workshop to prepare followers of Jesus to assess when, how and if to get involved when witnessing harm between people - neighbors in need. Facilitators from KSU's Center for Conflict Management will lead the training.
