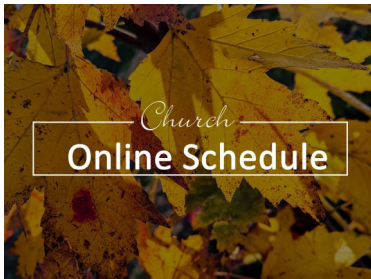

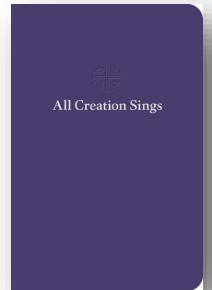

## Build a Longer Table

If you were at worship this past Sunday, you heard Pastor Dave refer to a hymn that was used at 8:30 worship, called "Build a Longer Table." This song is from a new supplement to the cranberry book *Evangelical Lutheran Worship (ELW)* titled *All Creation Sings (ACS)*.

*All Creation Sings* goes hand in hand with *ELW* to support the church's mission of worship in word and sacrament that leads to service and justice in the world. It is the result of the church body voicing a need for more material around four major topics: creation care, lament in times of crisis, healing and wholeness, and justice and peace.



The text of the hymn is below, and went well with Pastor Dave's sermon on "Boundary Crossings." We look forward to experiencing more that this new resource has to offer!

*Build a longer table, not a higher wall,

The Lutheran World Federation highlighted the Milagro Center in Guatemala writing on Facebook:

Guatemala: Empowering young women with education and life skills.

At the Milagro Women's Education in Guatemala City, the Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala (ILAG) is empowering young women with education and life skills, and with awareness about their rights.

The center is growing with 13 girls today, up from six three years ago, said ILAG President Rev. Karen Castillo Echeverria, when she participated in a recent training on women's human rights organized by LWF and partner faith-based organizations. Milagro, which means miracle, offers formal education, skills in baking, sewing and masonry, and music lessons. The young women, all from marginalized rural communities, also learn to plan finances, about women's rights, family planning and how to take care of their bodies. "Each time they go back on vacation to their villages, they develop a program that they teach in the community with ILAG's support," shared Castillo.

As the global annual training program shifts to a regional-based approach, Castillo is confident of the knowledge, skills and language she has acquired to stand up for women's rights and train others. "When we teach, we learn more and every opportunity to learn more is a treasure," she adds.

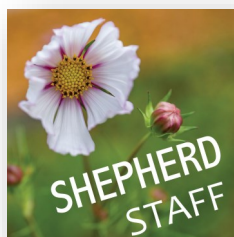


### Altar Flowers
