This Sunday, we as a congregation as well as others within our Synod will celebrate our partnership with our sister congregation in Guatemala Iglesia Luterana Augustina de Guatemala, (ILAG). For LCR this relationship dates back more than a decade and has focused on ILAG ministry and the Milagro Girls school. Both are housed on the ILAG campus in a suburb of Guatemala City. For LCR members this has proved to be a living partnership, as we marvel at their accomplishments on so many fronts. It is outreach as Christ intends.

ILAG was founded in 1991. Its ministry addressed those living on the margin of society, the indigenous poor. Guatemalan peoples lived in a state of civil war from November 13, 1960, until the peace accord was signed December 29, 1996 (36 years, 1 month, 2 weeks, and 2 days). The Maya people

plastic or wooden self-fashioned homes. Largely an agricultural society, they were unable to produce food for their families much less their livelihood.

95% of the population are Christian, so church plays an important role in communities and is the focus of social gatherings. The Lutheran Church in Guatemala has 2,000 members and 18 congregations. They stretch from the lowlands of Petan to the ravines of Guatemala City. Pastor Karen Castillo leads ILAG's ministry. She travels to all these congregations each month, conducting baptisms, weddings, confirmation, and pastoral duties needed, so a service may be 3 hours long when she is there. Within a week's time she will visit four or more congregations. Travel from Guatemala City to the initial congregation may be 8hrs by car, the next destination another 5 hours. Some require an additional 30minutes by boat and/or a 30-minute walk. Ultimately the return trip to Guatemala City may be 13 hours. Covid halted all public transportation for more than a year making a difficult journey even more so.

Guatemala has 22 different Mayan groups each with their own language so it has been vital for ILAG to focus on education, enabling local leaders to assume communication roles for their congregants as well as understand Lutheran identity and theology that some might become ministers of the Word, or even ordained to give sacraments. Education is supported by ILAG on many fronts. We at LCR have supported those leadership initiatives both financially as well as with our physical presence simply preparing meals for the rural pastors on retreat at the ILAG campus in Guatemala City.

Of the 18 million population, 50% are children. The government provides only a small portion a public education. Most that attend school do so in private institutions. With the cost at \$50 per child per month the vast majority cannot afford that especially if there are multiple children in the family. Three years ago, ILAG purchased a building within Guatemala City to house an elementary school. Our ILAG team toured it as it was being transformed in February 2020, Colegio Luterana Augustina de Guatemala. It was an exciting glimpse of things to come. Now 173 children are in attendance, encompassing 1st through 6th grades. There is a graduation party at the end of 6th grade since this is often the maximum education that is attained.

Girls especially in the rural communities have little or no access to education. They are often needed at home for house keeping or childcare while the mother works. Girls are frequently married off to older men by age 13 never realizing an alternative future. Milagro, "miracles," was a dream ministry for Pastor Karen. Milagro School houses girls from the rural congregations, ranging from 10-20yrs in age. This year attendance has grown to fifteen. The goal is for each to attain an education, learn a trade that they might have independent productive lives. They return to their community as leaders sharing their faith, knowledge, and self-worth. Teachers, lawyers, doctors, nurses, accountants, architects, chefs, and

Please know that with a portion of LCR's outreach budget the partnership team in 2021 was able to purchase much needed computers for the Milagro school in addition to our annual pledge of support. Each year in September a GALA raises significant monies to support the Milagro ministry. Save the date for September 10, 2022 GALA. We hope to see you there, in fact we extend an invitation to each of you to join us in personally walking in this ministry with ILAG. There are many within LCR that have participated, building latrines, and stoves in the rural villages, teaching sewing, knitting, gardening to the Milagro girls. Share their stories Sunday, better yet, come make your own.
